INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2023

I report on the accounts of Ring20 Research and Support UK CIO for the year ended 31 March 2023 which are set out on pages 1 to 4.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner
